

Responsible for liaising with Met Office and translating that information to determine whether to issue flood warnings to professional partners and members of the public when required.

Responsible for updating partners on the situation on the ground regarding main river flooding. Can provide technical information to the rest of the tactical group on areas currently affected by flooding and potential future impacts.

Has key pieces of plant equipment and personnel on the ground undertaking work on main rivers. This includes clearing blockages, instigating temporary defences or undertaking remedial actions on flood defences if required.





Responsible for the protection of life during an incident, rescue- including access to specialist equipment and rendering the incident site safe (e.g. contamination, chemicals).

Responsible for saving life and co-ordinating the multi agency response during an incident.



Development of Multi-Agency Emergency Plans.

Facilitating Multi-Agency Strategic and Tactical Coordinating Groups.

Multi-Agency Training & Exercising.





Deals with flooding from a public sewer.

Supplies potable water.

Deals with flooding from a burst water main.

Property (Riparian) Owners

Are responsible for ensuring that watercourses on, or adjacent to their land/property are unobstructed and adequately maintained.

Are responsible for protecting their own property, having home insurance, writing a personal flood plan and signing up to flood warnings (where appropriate).

Are responsible under the Flood and Water Act 2010 for leading the investigation into flooding incidents.

Are responsible for ensuring that ordinary watercourses are adequately maintained.

Provide temporary shelter.

Trent Valley Internal Drainage Board

Are responsible for providing a flood protection and water-level management service within the statutory drainage districts.

Have powers to undertake works on any watercourse within its district, other than a 'main river'.

Advise on developing flood conditions.
